HOW TO DO A RISK ASSESSMENT: A CASE STUDY

- 1) To identify the risks your ministry faces, review your strategic documents, programs, and financials from the perspectives of mission success, organizational health, and environment and make a list.
- 2) Provide your draft list of potential risks to your leadership team, then meet and watch the video from the blog post together. Have a discussion for their feedback and suggestions, recording any additional risks they identify.
- 3) When all risks have been identified, prioritize them based on how likely they are to happen and how much they could affect your ministry.
- 4) Use the Risk Analysis chart in the blog post as a template to help you determine how to manage each risk—whether through prevention, mitigation, or transfer/elimination.
- 5) Prepare a risk report for final review by management and presentation to the board. The ministry must then decide whether to accept any remaining risk or reject it by eliminating it.
