- 2) If your ministry doesn't already have one, develop a planning process to use for all future projects. Include obtaining objective validation from outside sources as a required step of the process.
- 3) Train your staff in the importance of having your ministry add thoughtful planning to all good intentions, including especially the need to check for blind spots. A question that should always be asked is "How do we know we know everything we should on this matter?" The commitment to doing things properly will prevent problems, allow your ministry to be an upstanding representative of God to the world, and advance your mission.
