- 1) As the leader of your ministry, do you have a clear vision of your ministry as being activist? If you see any pessimism creeping in, address it immediately.
- 2) How self-aware are you? When was the last time you took a personal spiritual retreat? If you're due for one, schedule it in your calendar and commit to taking the time to do it. It's a very important investment in yourself as a leader that can move your ministry forward exponentially.
- 3) Are you just plain tired and missing your former passion for your ministry? It might be time for a sabbatical to reignite the spark or to face the fact that it's time for someone else to lead in your place. Be open with your board and determine together what the best next steps for you and the ministry are.
