1. Since its founding, has your ministry changed its beliefs or interpretation of those beliefs?
 - a. If so, what has changed and are you comfortable with those changes?
 - b. Do those changes imply a change in what you believe about scripture or revelation?
2. What are the boundaries that you have set to safeguard your Christian mission?
 - a. What do you regard as non-negotiables and as disputable matters?
 - b. At what cost are you willing to defend the non-negotiables?
3. In the face of strong challenges to your non-negotiables, how can you show not only truth but also grace in how you respond?
4. Have your ministry's activities become cluttered with programs that are nice-to-dos but peripheral to your mission?
5. If you knew God would provide, what are some of the boldest, most radical ideas you have for fulfilling your mission?
 - a. Who could you partner with to help make them happen?
 - b. How can you increase prayer support for your ministry?
6. What is the most persuasive, objective evidence that you could give secular people to prove your ministry adds value to society?
7. How can the global, inclusive nature of Christianity be of help to your ministry?
